Heading	Content
Summary	Proposals for trails, interpretive media and visitor management (including car parking and landscape proposals for the forest area) which make links around Bellever Forest and Postbridge, using Whitehorse Hill as a means of developing further interest in the heritage of the area.
Project description	As a result of the development of the projects around Bellever and Postbridge this year an Access and Interpretation Plan was commissioned to set out what the community; including local residents, local businesses, landowners, Forestry Commission and Dartmoor National Park Authority would like to see happen in the area.
	Trails To engage the wide variety of visitors who come to the area, encourage them to stay longer and discover the landscape heritage of Bellever and Postbridge There will be a series of linked walks in three categories

- Short walks-
 - all ability trail
 - Village trail-including family activity
 - River and forest walk
- Long walks
 - Bellever Archaeology Trail
 - East Dart Waterfall Walk
 - Powdermills walk
- Outlier walks
 - o Powdermills
 - Warren House/Vitifer mine
 - o Bellever trail all ability access loop

To develop these walks there will need to be some path surfacing works to enable an all ability path and the creation of a new access into the forest

Interpretation

There will be 3 onsite orientation and interpretation panels at the Visitor Centre, Bellever/ Postbridge car park and Bellever Forest Picnic Area. There will be 1 smaller panel at Powdermills.

These panels will have QR codes and Near Field Communications(NFC) to allow further content to be accessed via a Smartphone or the Dartmoor Story App.

White Horse Hill has revealed some amazing finds. It is proposed that an interpretive display is created and that these be finally displayed at the Postbridge Visitor Centre.

A Dartmoor Story App will be developed for Smartphones as an interactive leaflet to help visitors learn more about the area and navigate. This will be developed as part of the PC1 Discovering the Dartmoor Story project. The app will be developed so that it can be adapted for Postbridge as 4 trails; the Postbridge Highlights Trail, the Bronze Age Bellever Trail, Waterfall Ramble and Postbridge Heritage Hunt.

Accommodating visitors to the area

To help reassure visitors coming to discover the heritage of the area the car park run by the Forestry commission will be relandscaped and integrated into the car parking provision for visitors in Postbridge-currently the car park by the visitor centre can be completely full on busy days whilst the car park across the road is empty.

The project will link in with the redevelopment of the Postbridge Visitor Centre PC8 and will focus people on the Bronze Age landscape of the area- in particular Whit Horse Hill and the finds that were discovered there.

Beneficiaries and communication

There is a great deal of archaeological remains from Bronze Age times nearby within Bellever Forest and around the nearby area. There are also industrial remains close by. It provides a great opportunity for visitors to easily access and learn about the heritage of the moor. As a result visitors

	to the moor will have greater appreciation and respect for the heritage of Dartmoor. The key message to visitors is that this area is a great place to begin to uncover the landscape story of Dartmoor. This project has been developed so far by local people working together with local organisations and agencies. For it to be successful this partnership must continue to work. It will require regular meetings, further consultation work as ideas are developed. The project will be supported by the MTMTE project team and all information about it will be on the MTMTE website.
Project buy-in	This project has been developed by the local community of Postbridge and Bellever, Forestry Commission, Dartmoor National Park Authority and MTMTE. Ideas were developed through the Landscape and Access plan.
Project lead	The MTMTE Project Team will be the project lead.
Partners / contractors etc.	Partners in this project will be the local community, Forestry Commission, Dartmoor National Park Authority, Dartmoor Pony Heritage Trust and other local organisations and businesses. These groups will work together to coordinate the overall project and work in smaller groupings to deliver specific elements of the project. Interpretive specialists will be contracted in to produce interpretive material such as signage and works associated to the app. working alongside local people. Path works and relandscaping will be undertaken by appropriate contractors.
Project development	Changed significantly following consultation with the community. New project promotes a series of walks and visitor management proposals in the Postbridge/ Bellever area to help people explore and learn about the Forest and the village and stay longer. The new proposals have been shaped by external consultants working with local community interests.
